

He made his debut against Gold Coast Suns at Metrion Stadium. Essendon won the match by 33 points. He kicked 1 goal. Walla is his nickname. In July 2020, he broke the record most consecutive games for Essendon in 10 games against Collingwood at the MCG.

Most memorable goal seen
Anthony McDonald had an amazing performance against North Melbourne in 2019, kicking 3 goals and his last goal for last goal of the game. From the on right side of the boundary line then Essendon won by 6 points making the score 20-10.

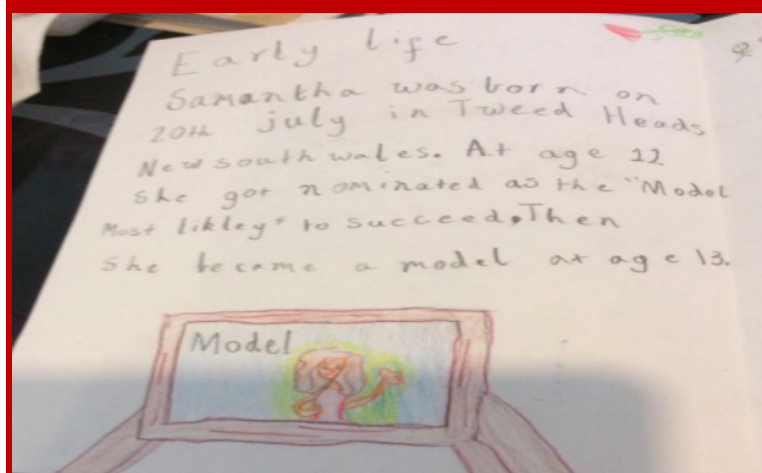
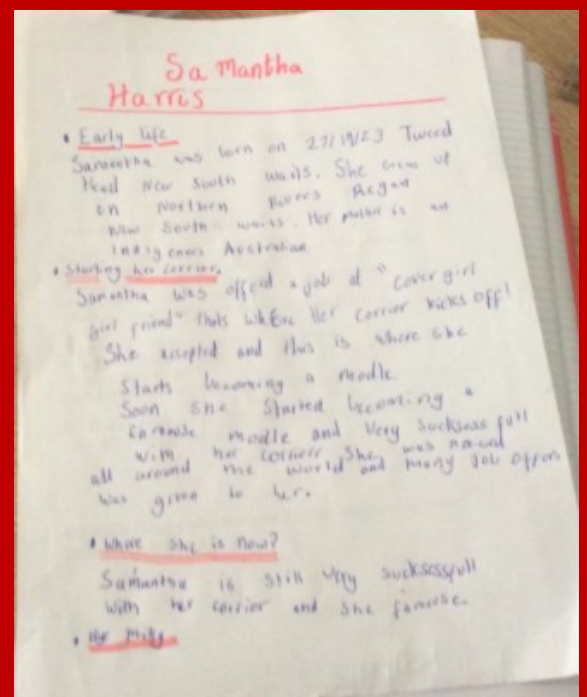
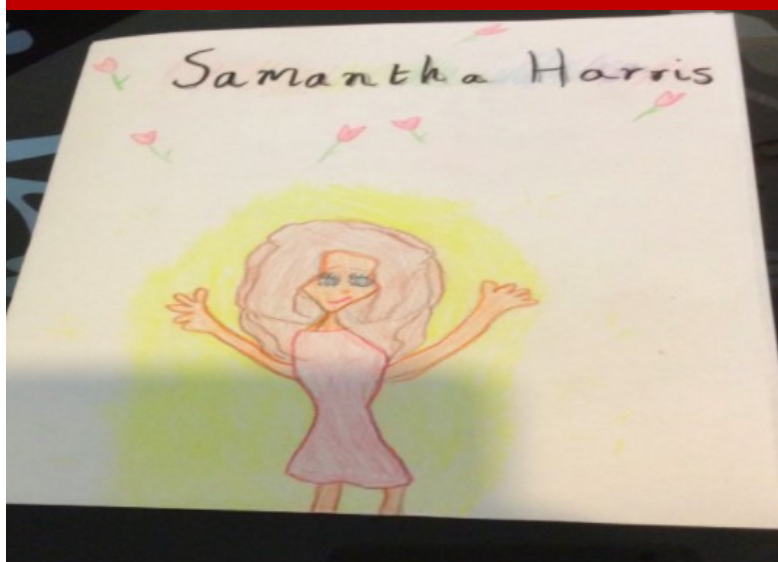
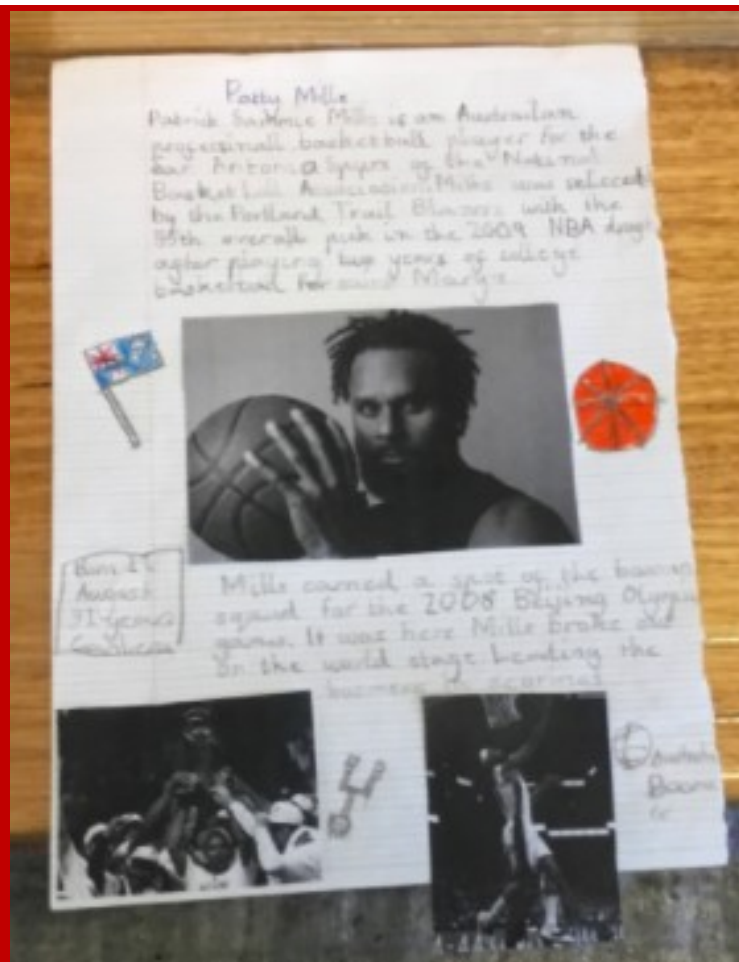
Early life
